P6 Maths & English Afterschool

Mrs Michelle Mc Cann will be taking an After-School Maths and English club for Primary 6 children starting on **Tuesday 12th March 2024**. The club will run on Tuesdays from 2:45 pm -3:45 pm and will cover the content that will be assessed in the new SEAG Transfer Test.

This club is optional and will cover work which is at the upper level of the children's ability. Any child who does not attend will still cover the full National Curriculum during the normal school day.

Due to the nature of the work, quite an amount of photocopying is required, and paper used, therefore, there will be a **charge of £30 per child** for those who wish to attend.

This term we hope that all children in Primary 3 will participate in a Paired Reading Programme, which we believe will encourage not only a wider interest in reading, but will also improve their reading skills in general. The project will last 10 weeks beginning Monday 19th February and provides a perfect opportunity for parental participation in the learning process. The aim of the club is to promote well-being, self-esteem and of course have lots of FUN. The club will take place after school on a Tuesday at 2:45-3:45pm. Group 2 commence their Afterschool on Tuesday 6th February. Please see dates below.

Swimming (P7)

Primary 7 will commence their lessons in February. The cost of swimming lessons is **£15**. This can be paid either in one instalment or two instalments of £7.50 via the School Money app. The dates for swimming lessons for P7 are **Friday 23rd February, 1st March, 8th March, 15th March and 22nd March 2024**. Swimming lessons are compulsory and part of our Physical Education Curriculum. Children with long hair **must** wear a **swimming cap**. All children must wear **goggles**. The children should wear their PE uniform into school on swimming days (Friday).

P7 Trip- American Folk Park "Flight From Famine"

As part of their WAU topic "Hunger", Primary 7 will travel to the American Folk Park on **Wednesday 6th March** to take part in the "Flight from Famine" workshop. The cost of the trip is **£12** and can be paid for via the School Money app. Children should wear their full school uniform.

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Multi-sport/Basketball After School Club (P7)

***P6 have their final session on Monday 5th February*.**

Funding has been secured through the Extended Schools Programme for an Afterschool Multi-sports/ Basketball programme for **Primary 7 pupils**. At St Mary's, we feel all our pupils should have the opportunity to live healthy and active lives. A positive experience of sport and physical activity at a young age can build a lifetime habit of participation. Physical activity has numerous benefits for children and young people's physical health, as well as their mental wellbeing (increasing self-esteem and emotional wellbeing and lowering anxiety and depression), and children who are physically active are happier and more resilient. This Afterschool will be facilitated by a trained professional and will be offered to Primary 7 pupils for 5 weeks on the dates below from 2:45pm-3:45pm on a Monday Afternoon. **Monday 19th February, Monday 26th February, Monday 4th March, Monday 11th March and Monday 25th March.** P7 children should bring their PE gear to school in a bag on these dates. The children will be permitted to change at home-time. **The children should be collected at 3:45 pm sharp.**

International Maths Day

St Mary's will take part in the International Day of Maths on the **14th of March**. Each year the worldwide event focuses on a particular theme. The aim of the themes is to connect mathematics to all sorts of subjects, fields and ideas, spark creativity and provide focus to the event. This year the theme is 'Playing with Maths'. It focuses on how mathematics can be a gateway to exploration, experimentation, and discovery, as well as a source of fun. All classes will participate in lots of fun maths activities on Thursday 14th March.

Mathletics (P3-P7)

St Mary's has invested a lot of money in Mathletics. We encourage **all** the children to continue working hard on Mathletics in Term 2. Unfortunately, some children have not used Mathletics in Term 1. Mathletics is an online learning platform that engages pupils through challenges and rewards. Linked to the National Curriculum, Mathletics supports children as they develop confidence in mathematics and allows them to practise key skills in a wide range of areas. It is designed to provide pupils with a captivating and safe learning experience which combines targeted and adaptive curriculum content, structured and interactive support, with engaging games and rewards.

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Nessy Programme for P2 and P3 Pupils

St Mary's has invested in the 'Nessy' programme for all our P2 and P3 pupils. Nessy Reading & Spelling is an internet-based literacy program that provides structured and personalised learning plans to support the children. It is very important that you encourage your child to continue using Nessy in Term 2 and allow your child to work through the programme independently.

Accelerated Reader

Congratulations to all those children who reached their AR target in Term 1! Your child was set a new individual AR (Accelerated Reader) target in January. The targets that are set for each child depend on two factors, the result of a Star Reading Test that each child sits at the start of the term and the teacher's estimation of the amount of time the child is likely to read each day.

After the Star Reading Test is taken, the children are awarded particular levels for their reading books. This is called their ZPD. The Accelerated Reading Program has determined that the child should read and take quizzes within these levels. It is so important that your child uses this fantastic resource for reading, to improve fluency and comprehension skills. The end date for Term Two's target is **Friday 22nd March 2024**. Please encourage your child to keep reading and **taking AR quizzes (independently)** to ensure he/she reaches 100% by **Friday 22nd March 2024**. Prizes will be awarded to those children who reach their target. As parents, you can ensure that your child gets the most out of the program by reading regularly and consistently and asking the children questions about the book they are reading. Make sure to ask your child about the scores they are achieving in the quizzes.
