School Holiday

Easter Holidays

Multi-sport/Basketball After School Club (P5)

Funding has been secured through the Extended Schools Programme for an Afterschool Multi-sports/Basketball programme for Primary 5 pupils. At St Mary's, we feel all our pupils should have the opportunity to live healthy and active lives. A positive experience of sport and physical activity at a young age can build a lifetime habit of participation. Physical activity has numerous benefits for children and young people's physical health, as well as their mental wellbeing (increasing self-esteem and emotional wellbeing and lowering anxiety and depression), and children who are physically active are happier and more resilient. This Afterschool will be facilitated by a trained professional and will be offered to Primary 5 pupils for 6 weeks on the dates below from 2:45pm-3:45pm on a Monday Afternoon. (3rd March, 10th March, 24th March, 31st March, 7th April, 14th April,)

All P5 children must be collected promptly at 3:45pm from the school.

Primary 7 Youth Engagement Programme

Our Primary 7 children have had the opportunity to take part in a fully funded Youth Engagement Programme. This programme was facilitated by Speedwell Trust and the children took part in a range of outdoor sporting activities with our Shared Education partner schools. P3 Art Afterschool

Art Club for Primary 3 will run for 5 weeks. (February 19th, February 26th, March 5th, March 12th March 19th 2025). We successfully applied for funding from the Extended School's initiative for this club so there will be no charge. The Art Afterschool will be led by a specialist Art teacher, Mrs Karina Avene (Aveka Art). Art gives children a way to communicate and develop confidence and it also encourages creativity. It will also improve fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination and helps children to develop their communication and vocabulary skills. The benefits of art and craft activities stretch from academic and educational to personal and emotional. Taking part in Art will support your child's emotional wellbeing and help them to feel more confident, calmer and happier. All P3 children must be collected promptly at 3:45pm from the school.

Primary 4 Art Afterschool

P4 will commence Art Afterschool on **Wednesday 26th March** 2025 (2:45 – 3:45 pm) The Art Afterschool will run for 5 weeks (26th March, 2nd April, 9th April, 16th April & 30th April) **We kindly request that the children are picked up at** 3:45 pm sharp.

Creative Music Lessons (P4, P5, P6 & P7)

We are delighted to announce that St Mary's has secured funding for Creative Music lessons in St Mary's. These lessons will be delivered by Mrs Shannon Hackett, a specialist music teacher and we are delighted to be able to offer this Music Club *free of charge* through the Extended Schools Programme. Music has numerous benefits for children including; activating both sides of the brain, improving listening, concentration and problem-solving, improving working memory, confidence building, promoting creativity and self-expression and promoting well-being - reducing anxiety and stress. The music lessons will take place during the school day. Creative Music lessons will commence for P4 & P5 on Tuesday 18th March and will commence for P6 & P7 on Wednesday 19th March. *The final Music lesson for P3 is on Tuesday 4th March 2025*.

Swimming (P4)

Swimming lessons for <u>Primary 4</u> commence on <u>Friday 28th February 2025</u>. (7 lessons) The dates for swimming lessons for P4 are, February 28th, March 7th, March 14th, March 21st, March 28th, April 4th, April 11th. 'Swimming lessons are <u>compulsory</u> and part of our Physical Education Curriculum. Children with long hair must wear a swimming cap. All children must wear goggles. The children should wear their PE uniform into school on swimming days

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(Friday). The cost for swimming lessons is £26.00 and this can be paid for via the School Money App.

Cúchulainn Cup Camogie and Hurling (P6 & P7)

We are delighted to announce that St Mary's has been given the opportunity to further develop our pupils' Camogie / Hurling skills. Our school will be allocated 4 x one hour sessions with an Ulster GAA accredited coach, fully funded by Cúchulainn an Ghleanna Camogie and Hurling Club, with all required equipment provided. Accelerated Reader

Congratulations to all those children who reached their AR target in Term 1! Your child will be set a new individual AR (Accelerated Reader) target in January. The targets that are set for each child depend on two factors, the result of a Star Reading Test that each child sits at the start of the term and the teacher's estimation of the amount of time the child is likely to read each day.

After the Star Reading Test is taken, the children are awarded particular levels for their reading books. This is called their ZPD. The Accelerated Reading Program has determined that the child should read and take quizzes within these levels. It is so important that your child uses this fantastic resource for reading, to improve fluency and comprehension skills. The end date for Term Two's target is **Friday 4**th **April 2025**.

Please encourage your child to keep reading and taking AR quizzes (independently) to ensure he/she reaches 100% by <u>Friday 4th April 2025</u>. Prizes will be awarded to those children who reach their target. As parents, you can ensure that your child gets the most out of the program by reading regularly and consistently and asking the children questions about the book they are reading. Make sure to ask your child about the scores they are achieving in the quizzes. **PLEASE NOTE**- The children must read a combination of books and articles. (NOT JUST ARTICLES). The class teachers are monitoring this AR school rule.

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Mathletics (P3-7)

St Mary's has invested a lot of money in Mathletics. We encourage <u>all</u> the children to continue working hard on Mathletics in Term 2. *Unfortunately, some children have not used Mathletics in Term 1.* Mathletics is an online learning platform that engages pupils through challenges and rewards. Linked to the National Curriculum, Mathletics supports children as they develop confidence in mathematics and allows them to practise key skills in a wide range of areas. It is designed to provide pupils with a captivating and safe learning experience which combines targeted and adaptive curriculum content, structured and interactive support, with engaging games and rewards.
